Scene Eleven The Healing of a Leper

Taken from Matthew 8:1-4, Luke 5:12-16

CAST	
The	Leprosy is a horrible disease. In Jesus' time, people were thrown out of their villages and had
Leper	to live away from their communities and family. Often Lepers had to ring a bell to warn
	people they were coming into a public space. As the disease gets worse, and the skin
	becomes more infected, a leper would wear bandages to cover their sores. It would become
	painful to walk, and shameful to be seen in public. We do not know much about this person
	with leprosy, other than they showed great courage in approaching Jesus in public.
Jesus	We are largely dependent upon the four Gospels for what we know about Jesus and his life.
	After his baptism, Jesus gathered friends around him as he preached, taught and healed
	people and ministered to individuals. Jesus met growing opposition from the Pharisees and
	others who regarded him as an unorthodox rabbi. He travelled to Jerusalem for the pilgrim
	festival of Passover, aware he was going to die.
Crowd	Everywhere Jesus went, people heard about him and began to follow him, wanting to see and
	hear more from this special person. Some of the crowd might be market traders, or shop
	owners, others could be going about their daily lives and witness Jesus' amazing miracles.
Disciples	Jesus gathered friends around him, followers often called disciples. They travelled together,
	and accompanied Jesus, listening and watching as he healed many people. Like all of us, these
	disciples were only human, so they too would have worries and doubts, hopes and fears
	about Jesus' actions.

Jesus, followed by his disciples and a crowd of people, walks past a bundle of rags. The rags move. It is a leper. The disciples and crowd all back away, some in fear, others in disgust.

LEPER: Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean

Jesus reaches out the Leper's hand,

JESUS: I am willing. Be clean

It is as if a stocking has been removed from the Leper's arm and face. The Leper is healed.

LEPER: I'm healed! I'm Cured!

The leper runs off to tell everyone but is stopped by Jesus. The crowd and disciples react to this miracle.
